- f) What according to Woolf should be left for the "historian of literature" to "decide"?
- g) Why does Woolf state that Mr. Bennett is both the "worst culprit" and the "best workman"?
- h) In "not merely labour thrown away but labour misplaced", which "labour" is Woolf referring to?
- i) What according to Woolf is "not" the "task of the novelist"?
- j) In "out of 'that' alone must he construct his work", what is Woolf referring to by "that"?
- k) In "if we approach a poet without this prejudice", which "prejudice" is being referred to by Eliot?
- What is the "suggestive analogy" that Eliot offers to explain what he means by the "mind of the poet"?
- m) How is the "mind of the mature poet" different from "that of the immature one"?
- n) In which respect is the episode of "Paolo and Francesca" similar to the "voyage of Ulysses"?
- o) What is the "one error" that Eliot refers to as he talks about "eccentricity in poetry"?
